AOC Elections 2017 The AOC elections for President in 2018, At-large Director and local regional (US) Directors will end on 31 September. UK Chapter members can vote for the new President due to take up office at the Annual Symposium late in 2018 and the At-large post, for which there are two openings and 9 candidates, eight of whom are US citizens. It is noteworthy that the non-US candidate is our very own Academic Director, Professor David Stupples, who some of you will have heard speak at Chapter events and conferences in London, Rotterdam, Singapore and DSEI on subjects like “EW in the Urban Environment” and “Hybrid Warfare” covering areas such as EW in the fight against terrorist and Russia’s recent military actions and capabilities. Only around 10% of the AOC’s 13,000 plus members generally vote; the non-US component stands at 20% of the overall membership, and is the fastest growing sector. The low turn-out means that every vote counts. David’s thesis is that more non-US AOC directors makes sense, and is indeed essential to the future well-being and growth of the Association. AOC Chapters are not permitted to endorse individual candidates or work to get them elected but if you want to make a difference, please vote. AOC Pavilion & EW Seminar DSEI 12-15 Sept 2017, ExCeL, London. In a new departure for 2017 the AOC Pavilion was in the prestigious Joint Zone for the 4 days of DSEI; it was manned by UK Chapter volunteers. The **first DSEI AOC EW Seminar** was held in the West Theatre on Day 1, Tuesday 12 September.



Air Marshal Phillip Sturley chaired the seminar; speaking were Maj Gen Borys Kremenetskyi, Ukraine Defence and Air Attaché; Professor David Stupples; Wg Cdr Garry Crosby RAF (Retd) and Cdr Dave Hewitt. Immediately after the Seminar, the UK Chapter and entire AOC recognised Dr Alfred Price's lifetime contribution to EW. In the first photograph John Clifford OBE is briefing from the Award nomination and explaining Dr Price's contributions over 50 year. The second image shows Air Marshal Sturley presenting the AOC EW Technology Hall of Fame award to Alfred's brother, Geoffrey Price. The third shows Geoff making a short acceptance speech on behalf of the members of Alf's family who were present. Other images show the seminar speakers and the AOC EW Pavilion. We enrolled 15 new members at DSEI -12 from UK (including 4 under 26's), one from Canada, one from Sweden and one from Abu-Dhabi.

SAVAGE 'LITTLE' WARS

FRIDAY 13 OCTOBER 2017

This year's Autumn Symposium will again be held at STEAM, Museum of the Great Western Railway, Fire Fly Avenue, Swindon, SN2 2EY (www.steam-museum.org.uk). For drivers, a map is available on that website; but **DRIVERS PLEASE NOTE – Swindon is a complex town to navigate by road, and especially so at morning and evening rush hours. If in doubt, come by train if you can!** For those who this year opt to come by train, Swindon is easily reached via the London Paddington/ Bristol line, and STEAM is 10 - 20 minutes' walk from Swindon Railway Station. Turn right outside the Station, stay on the right-hand side pedestrian path and keep going until you come to a pedestrian sign that directs you through the GWR tunnel that connects to the Churchward site. Your route will pass English Heritage HQ and Thomas Homes apartments, soon leading to STEAM Museum. Steam has its own café, and there are other eateries close by; near at hand also is a Designer Outlet, and so given our Symposium, a Designer Outlet and other shops and cafes, all tastes should be catered for!

The Symposium programme will start with Registration and coffee at 0900-1000 and will end around 17.00. The DEHS Annual Meeting will be held during the day. Presentation topics will include Professor Graeme Gooday and Dr Liz Bruton, on the *Russo-Japanese War*; Brian Austin, on the *Rhodesian Bush War*; Mike Dudgeon, on *Habbaniya, Iraq, 1941*; and in the 'little' war of espionage, a two-screen two-speaker presentation by Arthur Bauer and Phil Judkins on *Klatt-Ostro-Josephine*, contrasting British intelligence and the German Abwehr on these three key agents for the Eastern Front and the D-Day invasion.
